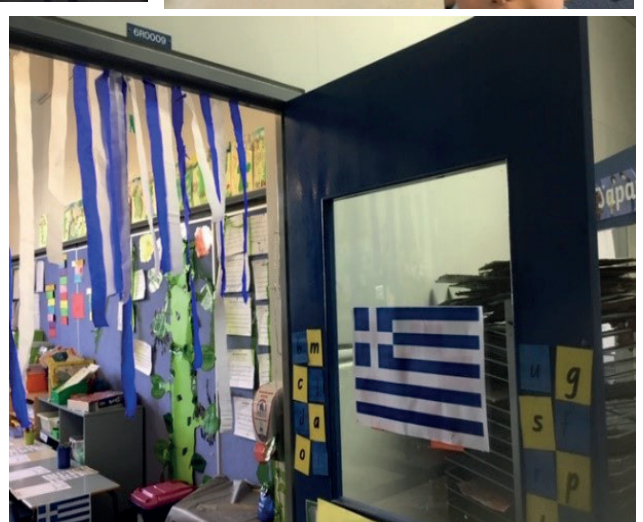
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Kindergarten Culture Day

A program supporting mothers to raise happy, respectful, non violent boys aged 6-8 years old.

What happens?

The program is run by a female and male facilitator. The day will include mothers and their sons working together however have times where you will be doing separate activities. Lunch is included and limited childminding for siblings is available.

The sessions explore the role of the mother and where parenting skills and ideas come from; emotion regulation; the importance of male role models in a son's life and what masculinity means today. As a group we focus on the developing of a strong, enduring and positive connections between mothers and sons and healthy relationships beyond the family sphere.

Why a Mothers and Sons program?

We know there are increasing rates of son to mother violence, and we have been asked by many mothers for guidance and support on how to raise their sons, so they become respectful men.

As there are no programs like this in Australia, we developed our own (called Mothers and Sons Program!). It is specifically designed for boys 6-8 years old, as research tells us this is the critical time to teach boys not to be violent.

It doesn't mean the boys are violent now, or they have challenging behaviours – we just want to give both mother and son skills and strategies to make sure it never happens.
