### Principal's Report

#### Education Week 2019

Thank you to all of our families for supporting the day. The smiles on students' faces in their classes reflected their pride, while the atmosphere in the playground was one of family, fun and friendship.

I personally found it so enjoyable taking time to spend talking with our families, of which many don't get opportunities to visit our school often. 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### Safe People, Safe Places

In the last few weeks, it has been reported that a number of children across Wollongong have been approached by strangers. It is important to reinforce with children the correct action to take if they are placed in a situation where they feel unsafe. Below are some key messages for children to be aware of in ensuring their safety. I would encourage parents to reinforce the 'Safe People, Safe Places' messages with their children, including:

- Make sure your parents or another adult you know, knows where you are at all times.
- Always walk straight home or to the place you are walking to. Walk near busier roads and streets, or use paths where there are lots of other people.
- Know where safe places are – a shop, service station, police station, library or school. If you are ever frightened, you should go to one of these places and ask them to call the police.
- Learn about safe adults you can look for and talk to if you need help – police officers, teachers at school, adults you know and trust.
- Don't talk to people you don't know and never get into a car with someone you don't know. If a car stops on the side of the road and you don't know the person inside, do not stop.
- If you are scared and can use a phone, call 000 and tell them you are scared.
- If someone tries to grab you, yell out, 'Go away, I don't know you'. This lets other people know you have been approached by someone you don't know.

### Southern Stars

Last week, months of training finally came together as students from our school performed at Southern Stars. It was a huge week, with students out for four consecutive days. The show is such an amazing achievement for all involved, with 108 schools and over 3000 students and staff involved. I have heard such wonderful feedback from staff, students and families involved, which is what these sort of experiences are all about. Congratulations to everyone involved for being part of a truly special experience. I would especially like to thank Mrs McLerie and Ms Phillips for their organisation and commitment to ensuring this program was such a success this year.

Kindergarten have been using ozobots to assist in math games and the retell of fairy tales.

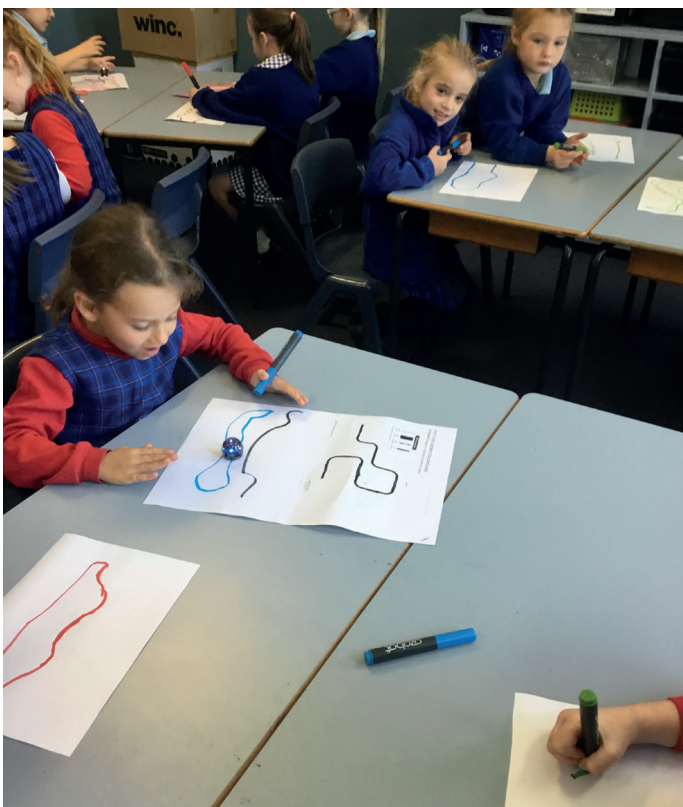
Year One have been using ozobots to create an interactive story.

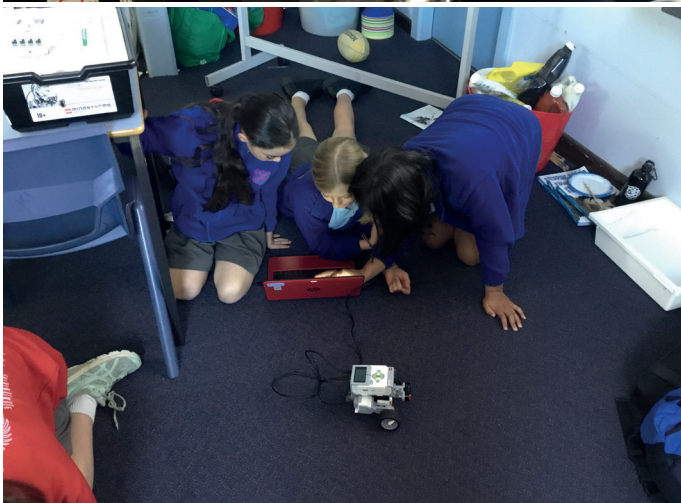
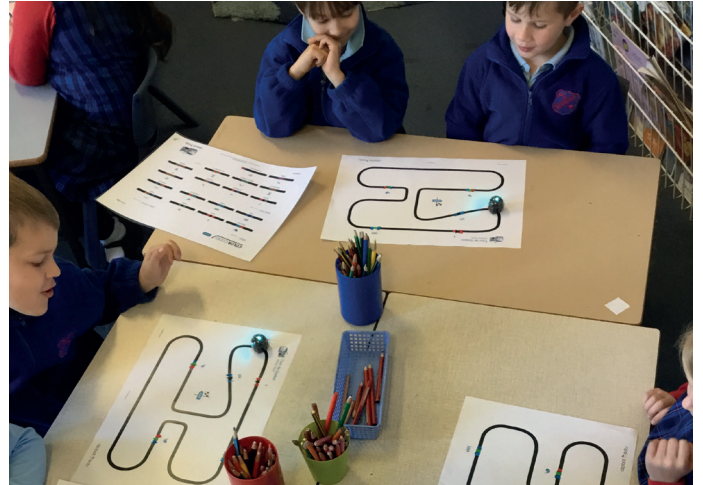

## The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

### Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

#### Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

#### Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

#### Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

### Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at [apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/sas](http://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/sas)

### How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

#### Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at [apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/sas](http://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/sas)

#### Step 2

The school endorses your application.

#### Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



### Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

#### Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week\*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off†
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.

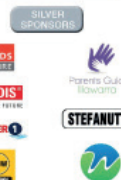
