CHECK IN ASSESSMENT

All Woonona Public School students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 have participated in the Check-in Assessment during Week 6 and 7. Each student completed two online assessments, reading and numeracy. The assessment will provide valuable data to identify how students perform in literacy and numeracy and help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. The insights gained from the results are essential because our teachers will be better able to support our students with the learning challenges faced during the learning from home period. A big thank you to Mrs Brown for her relentless work to enable our Year 3-6 students to complete the assessments.

YEAR 6 FUNDRAISER

Friday of Week 6 saw an exciting fundraiser led by our Year 6 students and teachers. What a fun and enjoyable day was had by all students K-6, as they engaged with lots of different activities. The highlight of the day was without a doubt the art challenge, that saw the whole school recreate some amazing art pieces. Congratulations Year 6 and teachers on a highly successful day.

YEAR 6 TO HIGH SCHOOL

Today was a little quieter at school, with students in Year 6, who are attending a public high school in 2022, visiting (where possible) their new school for an orientation day. It was great that this day could go ahead and that students had an opportunity to learn and interact in their new setting. We hope those students who attended, enjoyed what is always a highly anticipated and exciting day.

PRESENTATION DAY MODIFIED

On Monday 13 December, we will be holding a modified version of our annual Presentation Day assembly where we recognise the 2021 successes of Woonona Public School with our school community. Presentation Day usually consists of one assembly, however this year it will be split into two separate events – Year 6 Graduation Assembly and K-6 Class Recognition Awards.

Year 6 awards and graduation certificates will be presented at a special Year 6 Graduation Assembly on the morning of Monday 13 December. Year 6 parents (maximum of two per student), who are double vaccinated, will be permitted to attend this assembly, due to guidelines set by the NSW Department of Education. More information will be provided to Year 6 parents, closer to the date.

The K-6 Class Recognition Awards will be presented in the middle session on Monday 13 December. Unfortunately, due to NSW Department of Education guidelines, no parents or special guests will be permitted on site for this event. Those parents who have children receiving awards will receive letters shortly and will be invited to a live-stream that will also be watched by all students and staff across the school. The 2022 School Captains and Prefects will be announced at our K-6 Class Recognition Awards.

SCHOOL BANKING FINISHES PERMANENTLY

As mentioned in the Week 6 newsletter, the school banking program will no longer be available to students and families. This is not a school decision, but rather the decision of the NSW Department of Education who has decided that school banking, in its current form, does not meet the needs of students and their families.

BOOK FAIR

In Week 6 and Week 7, Mrs Carroll hosted our annual Book Fair. What a hive of activity and excitement the library was, as students first explored what was available, and then made purchases. Over \$14000 in sales were made in three days – a huge effort from Mrs Carroll and Ms Hodson! In addition, we thank our community for getting behind our students and school with such fantastic support. We will now receive over \$4000 to put into book purchases for our own Library, which is great news for our students who will have lots of new books to enjoy in 2022.

ACADEMICALLY GIFTED CLASS

On Wednesday of Week 5, a celebration Zoom took place for the four students who were part of the Wollongong North Year 5 Academically Gifted Class for 2021. While their program was modified due to the impact of COVID, we are very proud of Charlie, Ryan, Sam and Levi for their involvement and I know they all found the class challenging, engaging and enjoyable. I'm sure they are looking forward to taking some of the skills and experiences they have had this year and using those as they grow and develop throughout their learning journey.

SEMESTER 2 REPORTING

Our third Kindergarten Session occurred last Thursday, with 45 of our 2022 cohort turning out to learn more about their new school. Mr Loosemore, Miss Sibley and Mrs Stewart led the students through a fun and engaging session, which finished with a lovely story. I am very proud of all the students for working hard to stay on track to complete this challenge during such a difficult year. Premier's Reading Challenge awards and certificates will be handed out to students in Week 10.
